## <u>8:05 Divest</u>

- Special guest: Professor David Hsu
  - o Proponent of divestment

- Associate professor in DUSP, part of MIT Energy initiative and many other climate related groups on campus
- Research and teaching focused on democratic institutions in energy system
- Presentation on UA endorsement of divest
  - Five points
    - Leadership inside MIT
      - Admin working on new climate action plan
      - Is this plan, a "leading" plan
      - Has engagement with fossil fuel companies had positive impact on climate change?
    - Importance of our generation
      - Huge role to play in avoiding a climate catastrophe
      - Older generations unlikely to push for the changes needed to mitigate climate change

- Non -financial implications of money
  - Influence of money
    - Drug trialss
    - Soft power in politics
    - Journalism
    - Global health
  - Conflict of interests in working with fossil fuel and promoting sustainability
  - Previous MIT scandals
    - Epstein
    - Saudi Arabia
    - o Koch brothers, fossil fuel companies, ...
- Financial risk
  - Jeremy Grantham of GMO investment believes that there is no downside to divesting in fossil fuels because of financial underperformance
  - Argues that there is only downside to fossil fuel investment if we are in a 'carbon bubble'
- Leadership outside of MIT
  - Peer institution
    - Stanford: divested from coal 7 years ago and -80% carbon goal by 2021
    - Umass Amherst, UMichigan, and others with -100% carbon goals and ambitious divestment goals in the next few years
    - o Harvard:-100% by 2026, unsure about divestment
    - MIT: far far behind, -32% carbon goal and uncertainty in divestment
- Who is going to lead on climate at MIT?
  - Could be the students in the UA.
- Q&A
- Has shareholder engagement ever worked with fossil fuel companies?
  - Huge market cap of these companies so shareholders like MIT with very little sway on company direction
  - Size and scale as well as trajectory of companies themselves indicate very little probability in engagement actually working
  - These companies will likely still want to work with MIT because we provide unparalleled innovation/research for them
- Why is research and innovation not enough?

- Community, values, and culture as important as research contributions to climate advocacy
- Hypocritical to fund research with dollars from these fossil fuel companies
- How can we divest without losing policy power?
  - Actually, we help provide legitimacy to these fossil fuel companies which we retain (and may even strengthen) by divesting from them
- Discussions
  - o Some councilors able to gauge constituents, polls showing overwhelming support
  - But, want to make sure that council stays informed and involved in this issue after the resolution vote
    - Use this resolution to lobby administrators on this topic, UA lends added credibility that the undergraduate body is in support of divestment
